





Ingush

Ingush (romanized: *Ghalghai*) historically known as *Durdzuks*, *Gligvi* and *Kists*, are a Northeast Caucasian ethnic group mainly inhabiting the Republic of Ingushetia in central Caucasus, but also inhabiting Prigorodny District and town of Vladikavkaz of modern-day North-Ossetia. The Ingush are predominantly Sunni Muslims and speak the Ingush language.

The endonym of Ingush people is *Ghalghai* which most often is associated with the word "ghāla" (гала), meaning "tower" or "fortress" and the plural form of the suffix of person, "gha" (гa), thus, translates as "people/inhabitants of towers".


Kyrgyz

The **Kyrgyz people** are a Turkic ethnic group native to Central Asia. They primarily reside in Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, and China. A Kyrgyz diaspora is also found in Russia, Tajikistan, and Kazakhstan. They speak the Kyrgyz language, which is the official language of Kyrgyzstan.

The earliest people known as "Kyrgyz" were the descendants of several Central Asian tribes, first emerging in western Mongolia around 201 BC.





Kazakh

Kazakh people are a Turkic ethnic group native to Central Asia, primarily living in Kazakhstan, where they form the majority, with significant populations also in China, Uzbekistan, Russia, and Mongolia, known for their nomadic heritage, distinct language, and adherence to Sunni Islam. They emerged from Turkic and Mongol tribes in the 15th century, developing a unique culture shaped by steppe life, horse riding, and strong clan bonds. Today's Kazakh society is diverse and generally tolerant, with deep respect for elders and traditions.






Portuguese




Romanian

Lithuanian

About Barbara Jagiellon

(1478-1534)



Barbara Jagiellon was a princess of the Kingdom of Poland and of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania, member of the **Jagiellonian dynasty** and by marriage Duchess of Saxony.

Born in Sandomierz, she was the sixth daughter of King Casimir IV of Poland and Archduchess Elisabeth of Austria. She was named after her great-grandmother, Barbara of Cilli, Holy Roman Empress.
